• MM gave a report on IAAF World Athletics Championships in Doha and the performances of the Auckland athletes that participated. His first comment was of the oppressive heat the athletes had to endure.

Major Projects:

Strategy and Business Plan:

 Business Plan now finalised with initiatives and tasks identified from Strategic Plan to be implemented over next 5 years. These include a number of tasks for Coaching, Officials and the three sections. DS hopes that Section Meetings will work through the plan and report back to the Board on how they are achieving initiatives.

Marketing:

- AR spoke to a very well throughout and in-depth marketing report update. In addition to
 the AAI Home website he proposes a separate Marketing Website dedicated to attracting new
 memberships. While the main AAI website will remain as the priority website this site would
 give an overview on why people should join athletics and create more blog content (articles)
 newsletter style.
